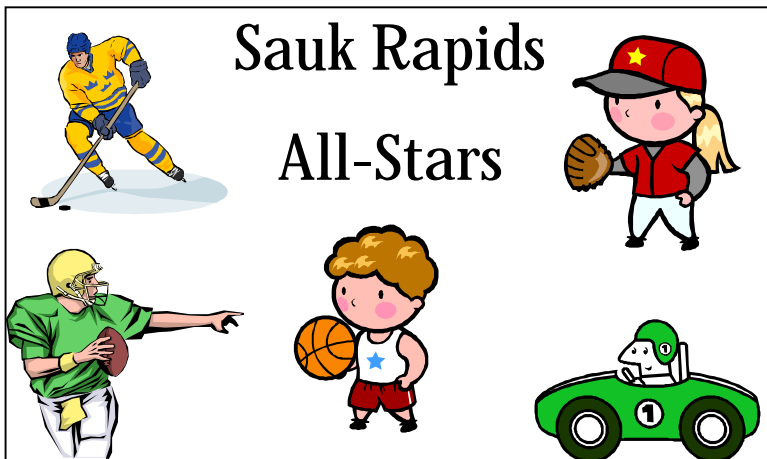

Fellow Women of Today Members,

The Sauk Rapids parade committee is looking for volunteers to walk along the route prior to the parade and sell pop. In addition to selling pop we would be allowed to **hand out flyers promoting the Sauk Rapids Women of Today**. There are thousands of people that attend this parade so I think it would be a great opportunity. The parade is **Friday June 27th** and starts at 6:00 pm. The people selling pop will start walking the route around 4:30 beginning in the parade line-up area (11th St. N from 6th Ave to Summit Ave) and then along the route (6th Ave N near Pleasantview Elementary to 1st St. S and ending up at the Middle School). The details as far as actual starting points have not been worked out yet, some may take the 1st half of the route while others take the 2nd half, but this gives you a general idea. People will be walking the route ahead of the parade only - it gets too crazy once the parade reaches an area. Therefore, volunteers will still be able to enjoy watching the entire parade.

This will be officially voted on at the June 16th General Meeting. **Please let me know ASAP if you would be interested in volunteering.** I put a short blurb about the Women of Today in the ad book which serves as the pageant program, has the parade line-up/map, and will be the Food Fest program. There will be **10,000** of these books printed and distributed throughout the area.

Also, the volunteers would need to provide their own wagons and/or coolers. If the Women of Today could provide 8-10 people for this project it would be great (families are welcome to help as well). Even if you are unable to help but can provide wagons and/or coolers that would be appreciated also.

The annual Budget and By-Law Review was held on June 3, 2008.

By-law changes

Article III – Membership

Sec 2 - Honorary local membership shall be awarded to the immediate past president, however, the immediate past president must pay her/his own state dues – Remove and Renumber

J. Shall take participation sheets with to all meetings and keep records on who attends. – Change to Update and manage project participation log.

K. Add Assist the President in arranging tables in meeting room prior to meeting.

Sec 3 – Programming Vice President

A. Notify the membership at meetings of the time and place of the next meeting. – Remove and renumber.

Sec 6 – Treasurer

I. Shall have night deposit envelopes available for all money-related projects. – Remove and renumber.

L. Assist the President in arranging tables in meeting room prior to meeting. – Remove and renumber.

Article X – Committees

Sec 1 – Internal Programming Manager positions

A. Change Personal Enrichment to The Living & Learning LPM shall promote participation and provide information and project ideas in the area of personal growth of members including intellectually, spiritually, civically, and through family. He/she will promote the Effective Writing, Speaking, and Impromptu competitions. He/she will oversee invocations and benedictions at meetings.

B. Change mailing a newsletter 5 days before general meeting to mailing a newsletter monthly.

C. Focus on Women - Remove & Renumber

D. STEP - Remove & Renumber

E. Chaplain/Family Involvement - Remove & Renumber

B. The year-end awards shall be – Change to The following year-end awards will be decided by voting of the general members at the March meeting. The president shall make final decision in case of a tie.

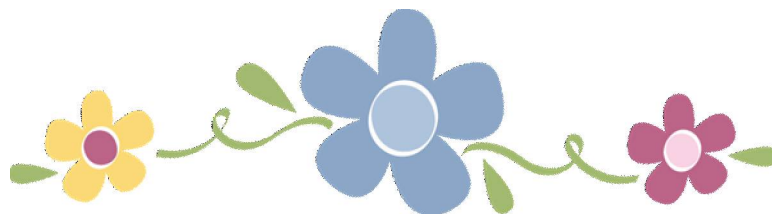
